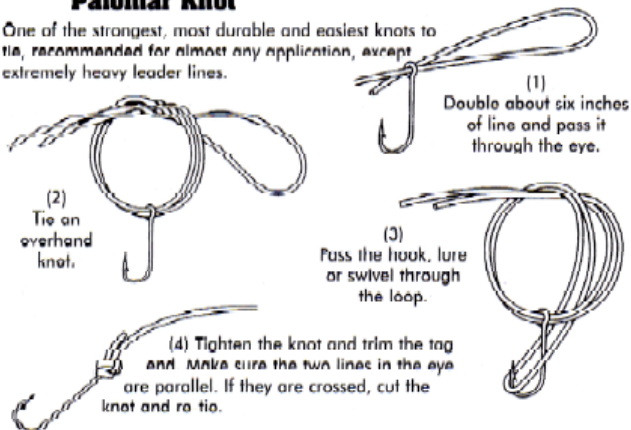


# Knots You Need To Know

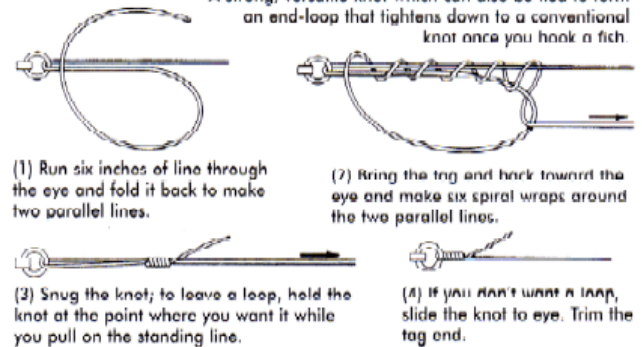
## Palomar Knot

One of the strongest, most durable and easiest knots to tie, recommended for almost any application, except extremely heavy leader lines.



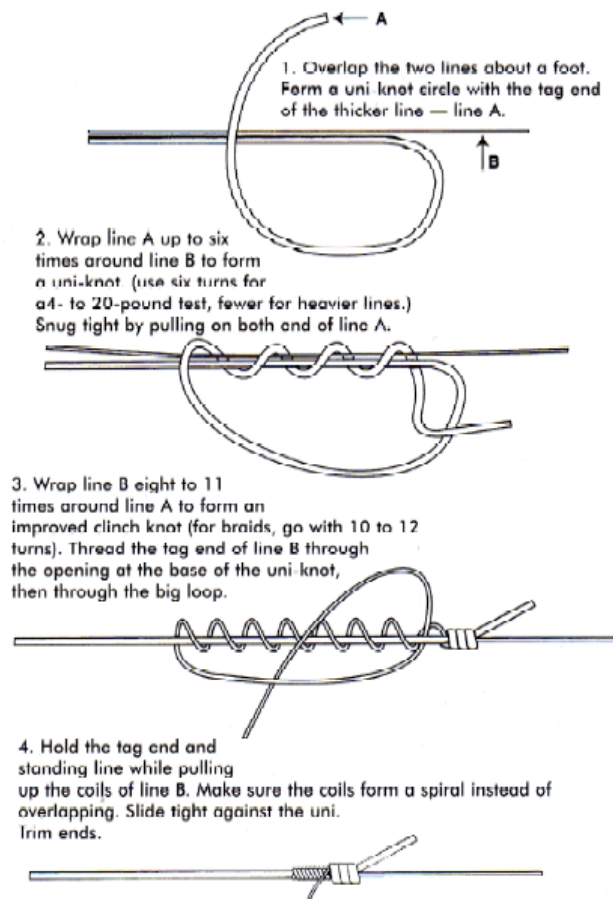
## Uni-Knot

A strong, versatile knot which can also be tied to form an end-loop that tightens down to a conventional knot once you hook a fish.



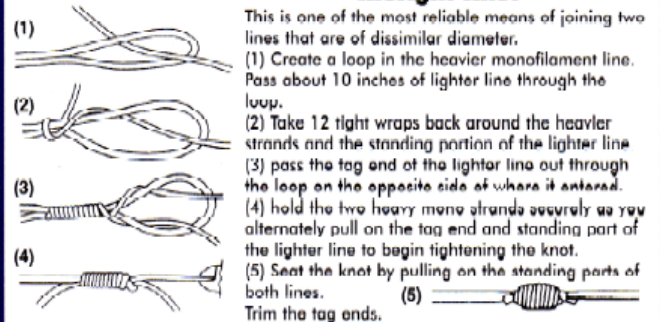
## Strenuous Connection

Still looking for the right knot to connect two lines of varying diameters, including thin-diameter braids to monofilament and fluorocarbon leaders? This knot combines the ease and strength of the standard uni-knot and the improved clinch knot to provide the highest knot strength. (When tying mono to mono, the uni portion of the knot must be tied with the heavier line.)



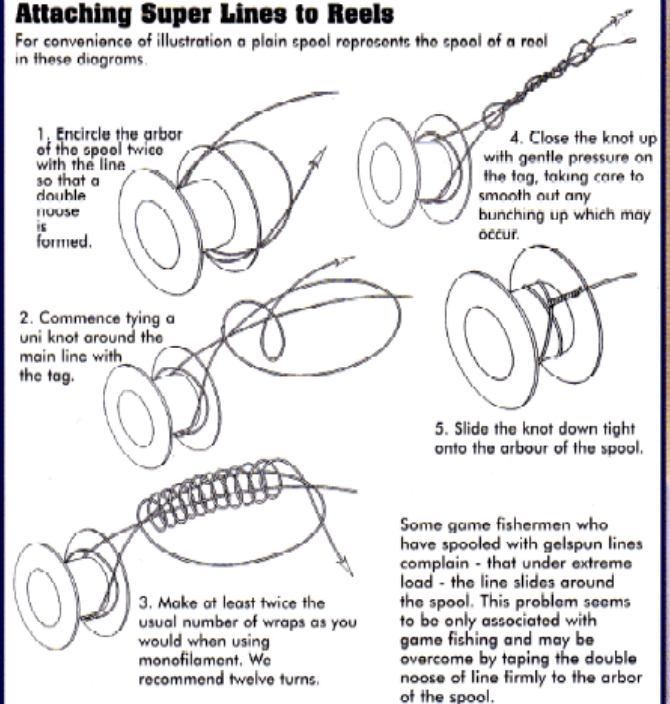
## Albright Knot

This is one of the most reliable means of joining two lines that are of dissimilar diameter.



## Attaching Super Lines to Reels

For convenience of illustration a plain spool represents the spool of a reel in these diagrams.



Some game fishermen who have spooled with gelspun lines complain - that under extreme load - the line slides around the spool. This problem seems to be only associated with game fishing and may be overcome by taping the double noose of line firmly to the arbor of the spool.
